We pray 2 Chronicles 7:14 If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.

But We shy from 2 Chronicles 7:19 But if ye turn away, and forsake my statutes and my commandments, which I have set before you, and shall go and serve other gods, and worship them; 20 Then will I pluck them up by the roots out of my land which I have given them; and this house, which I have sanctified for my name, will I cast out of my sight, and will make it to be a proverb and a byword among all nations.

Please, pastors, teachers and leaders - teach that more than repentance is needed. If we teach and believe that we can still restore the nation, false prophets such as Glenn Beck who teach that it is not the Laws of God as recorded by Moses, but modern conservative values, such as choosing our own leaders and tolerance for race mixing and tolerance for other religions except Islam that shall save the nation. Such men shall appear as saviors to us and many shall be decieved to follow those false saviors. The Jesus modern conservatives worship would not be recognizable to the Apostles. That Jesus is false.

A loving father promises his son his own car if he cleans, maintains and keeps gas in the family car for six months. The first month, the son fails completely, but pleads repentance. Father forgives him and reaffirms the promise to deliver the car. Second month, the son fails again, but repents again. Father again forgives and reaffirms. The next four months are same, but on the eve of his sixteenth birthday, the son not just begs and pleads, but works feverishly on the family car. He works all night. Does the loving father give him the car? Or does father teach him a lesson.

What did our loving Father do in Numbers 14 when we failed to enter Canaan and after hearing our punishment, we confessed our sin and raised an army to do the work? We sent the army in. We trusted that God would deliver. We put our selves in harms way to prove our faith. We were the son working all night to correct our mistake. What did God do?

We shall not restore the Kingdom by our works, by our hands. We shall not regain the nation by electing good leaders. We shall not bring back the Kingdom by re-population anymore. We lost that chance. Not in the 1950s not in 1865 but in 600BC. Look back to the Law. Malachi 4:4 Remember ye the law of Moses my servant, . . before the coming of the great and dreadful day of the LORD:

Leviticus 26:40 If they shall confess their iniquity, and the iniquity of their fathers, with their trespass which they trespassed against me, and that also they have walked contrary unto me; 41 And that I also have walked contrary unto them, and have brought them into the land of their enemies; if then their uncircumcised hearts be humbled, and they then accept of the punishment of their iniquity:

Only after we accept our punishment, take our licks, not before, shall our Loving Father restore the Kingdom. Not try to bring in the Kingdom ourselves. But only those who first accept the punishment, live through it and "the love of many shall wax cold. But he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved." Only they are heirs of the Kingdom.

The prophets agree.

Isa 1:15 And when ye spread forth your hands, I will hide mine eyes from you: yea, when ye

make many prayers, I will not hear: your hands are full of blood.

Isa 59: 2 But your iniquities have separated between you and your God, and your sins have hid his face from you, that he will not hear.

Jer 7:16 Therefore pray not thou for this people, neither lift up cry nor prayer for them, neither make intercession to me: for I will not hear thee.

Jer 11:14 Therefore pray not thou for this people, neither lift up a cry or prayer for them: for I will not hear them in the time that they cry unto me for their trouble.

Jer 14:11 Then said the LORD unto me, Pray not for this people for their good. 12 When they fast, I will not hear their cry; and when they offer burnt offering and an oblation, I will not accept them: but I will consume them by the sword, and by the famine, and by the pestilence.

Eze 8:18 Therefore will I also deal in fury: mine eye shall not spare, neither will I have pity: and though they cry in mine ears with a loud voice, yet will I not hear them.

Amo 5:23 Take thou away from me the noise of thy songs; for I will not hear the melody of thy viols. 24 But let judgment run down as waters, and righteousness as a mighty stream. 25 Have ye offered unto me sacrifices and offerings in the wilderness forty years, **O house of Israel** 26 But ye have borne the tabernacle of your Moloch and Chiun your images, the star of your god, which ye made to yourselves. 27 Therefore will I cause you to go into captivity beyond Damascus, saith the LORD, whose name is The God of hosts.

Mic 3:4 Then shall they cry unto the LORD, but he will not hear them: he will even hide his face from them at that time, as they have behaved themselves ill in their doings.

Hab 1:2 O LORD, how long shall I cry, and thou wilt not hear even cry out unto thee of violence, and thou wilt not save? 2:1 I will stand upon my watch, and set me upon the tower, and will watch to see what he will say unto me, and what I shall answer when I am reproved. 3:17 Although the fig tree shall not blossom, neither shall fruit be in the vines; the labour of the olive shall fail, and the fields shall yield no meat; the flock shall be cut off from the fold, and there shall be no herd in the stalls:

Our help comes only after the punishment. We shan't bring the Kingdom by our own hand, by our own actions.

18 Yet I will rejoice in the LORD, I will joy in the God of my salvation. 19 The LORD God is my strength, and he will make my feet like hinds' feet, and he will make me to walk upon mine high places.
